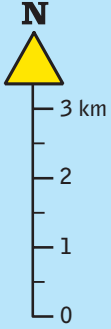

KÅLLANDSÖVÄGEN - TOURIST ROUTE

Welcome to Kållandsö! There is much to discover along the superb tourist route (red/white markings on the map). Follow the route or use it as a guide for your tour of Kinnekulle and plan your own detours. Below are explanations for the number symbols on the map. Happy travels!

- 1. RÖRSTRANDS MUSEUM** Visit the museum that tells the story of one of Europe's oldest porcelain factories, the crown jewel of Swedish porcelain – Rörstrand. The collections feature porcelain from 1726 through to the present day.
- 2. VÄNERMUSEET** Life in and around Lake Vänern is showcased in a variety of ways at Vänermuseet. Man's relationship to his local environment with Lake Vänern at its heart is explored from a natural, cultural and historical perspective.
- 3. SVALNÄS, VÄNERNS RIVIERA**(Lake Vänern's riviera) Experience a truly wonderful bathing spot with several kilometres of sandy beach. Thanks to the shallow water and the generally westerly winds, the water temperature tends to be extremely pleasant here.
- 4. HINDENS REV** The peninsula, which is 25-100 metres wide and 21 metres above sea level at its highest point, forms part of the central Swedish ice-edge zone. The entire area is a nature reserve and well worth a visit, with its distinctive scenery. A path runs right out to the tip, but it can be a bit tricky in places.
- 5. RACKEBY MEDELTIDA KYRKA** (Rackeby mediaeval church) The original church was built during the 11th century from hewn sandstone. The church was restored in 1699, at which time the chancel was demolished and the nave was extended to its current length.
- 6. STRÖ KYRKA** (Strö Church) Strö Church stands on a high ridge and is built from fine-hewn grey sandstone from Kinnekulle. Two windows are preserved from the original church dating from the 12th century. The church has an interesting history linked to Stola and Lindholmen. The façade features stone reliefs with motifs of human-like figures.
- 7. STOLA HERRGÅRD** (Stola Manor) The estate dates back to the Middle Ages and was owned by the Ekeblad family from the 1530s through to 1808. In summer, Stola is open to the public and guided group tours can be booked.
- 8. SUNNERSBERG MEDELTIDA KYRKA** (Sunnarsberg mediaeval church) With its tall slender spire, the church is highly visible from its position high on a hill. The original church was constructed in the 12th century or early 13th century and parts of this structure remain in the current western section of the nave. The church has been altered and renovated in several stages.
- 9. ULLERSUND** Beside the sound between Kålland and Kållandsö, remains of a harbour believed to be from the Viking era have been found. The remains are under water today just east of the bridge; similar remains in Denmark have been dated to the 11th century. Where Ullersund is at its narrowest, it is known as Läckö skans (fortlet), but it was previously called Riksbroskans.
- 10. HÖRVIKENS MARINA** With 400 berths and 20 guest berths, an Info Point, café, barbecue areas, mini supermarket, sandpit for children, showers, fuel and cycle hire.
- 11. SPIKEN** The freshwater harbour at Spiken is one of the biggest fishing harbours in Europe. In summer it is a hive of activity, with fish smokehouses, open-air dining, cafés, shops with handicrafts, and restaurants. You can purchase freshly-smoked fish, freshwater fish, processed fish products, the superb vendace roe and other delicacies.
- 12. LÄCKÖ SLOTT OCH NATURRUM VÄNERSKÄRGÅRDEN - VICTORIAHUSET** (Läckö Castle & Naturum Visitor Centre Vänerskärgården - Victoriahuset) The castle is a popular tourist attraction today, with guided tours, a kitchen garden, summer opera performances and cultural events. Naturum Visitor Centre Vänerskärgården - Victoriahuset was built as a gift for Crown Princess Victoria on her 30th birthday. It houses a hotel, restaurant and exhibition.
- 13. VILLABADET** (beach) With fine views of Kinnevik and Kinnekulle, Villabadet with its shallow waters and excellent beach is a short distance from the centre of Lidköping. It offers mini golf, a café and a playground.
- 14. NYA STADENS TORG OCH GAMLA RÅDHUSET** (Town square and old town hall) Explore the market stalls on Wednesdays and Saturdays in one of Europe's biggest market squares. The square is also the location of the Old Town Hall, which was previously a hunting lodge on Kållandsö and was moved here by Magnus Gabriel de la Gardie.
