The ferry starts from the Brommö side and goes to and from. The crossing takes around 4 minutes. For early and late season, the ferry must be booked the day before. To order the ferry and book wind shelters: +46 (0)10 471 80 11. Bicycles can not be booked in advance.

Brommö in the Lake Vänern

A little paradise island in Lake Vänern with fantastic beaches and beautiful nature. Private vehicle traffic is not permitted. The short distances attract cycle and walking tours. There is a marked walking trail and there are bicycles for rent.

Leave the car and take the ferry

You take the ferry to Brommö from Laxhall on Torsö island. There is a carpark here but also a bus stop, if you come by bus. The ferry timetable and information on the buses is on the reverse of the leaflet. At the ferry terminal on Torsö there is a restaurant open in the summer.

Swimming and outdoor life

Brommö enjoys rich animal and bird life and a landscape reminiscent of the west coast, with outcrops of rock and sand dunes. There are lovely bathing opportunities with sandy beaches in Store Vite Sand and Rövarsand.



From Rukehamn, at low tide, you can wade to the naturally beautiful Hovden which also offers bathing. To help you enjoy the outdoor life on Brommö, wind shelters, dry toilets and fire pits are provided at Sandvik, Rukehamn and Store Vite Sand.



The marked walking trails around the island are approximately 15 km in length. With the exception of the southern section from Knipan to Ruke-hamn, they are easy going. The cycling route, going on gravel roads, are marked counterclockwise. Bicycles are for rent at the ferry terminal on the Brommö side.

Bring a picnic

There are no shops, cafés or kiosks on Brommö, so remember to bring what you want to eat and drink with you on your visit. Allemansrätten (Right of Public Access) applies in the Brommö archipelago. It is permitted to camp or moor your boat in the same place for two days. Please note that parts of the island are nature reserves.

Brommö life in photographs

Take a look in the Glasmagasinet by the terminal while you are waiting for the ferry. There is a display of amateur photographs of known and unknown people who lived out their lives on Brommö. In summer it is open daily.
